CAFE Undergraduate Experiential Research Project Grants Program

CALL FOR APPLICATIONS

Grants Program Background and Purpose

The Research Office of CAFE sponsors the Undergraduate Experiential Research Project grant program. The goal of this grant program is to encourage undergraduate students to participate in enhanced educational experiences that advance their professional career opportunities through engagement in creative projects and research activities, and to develop their skills and leadership potential. Funding priority will be based upon the quality of the proposed work, the likelihood of the project to provide value-added experiences to advance the student's career, and alignment with the priorities of the College.

GUIDELINES FOR PROPOSALS

- Funding Priorities: Projects should address or be related to the broad goals of the College Strategic Plan; Building our Future on the Land-Grant Legacy.

 Projects should have the potential for economic, social, or environmental impact in Kentucky.
- 2. The Undergraduate Experiential Research Project grant program is requesting applications for grant proposals. The fall semester grant proposal submission deadline (Wednesday, November 1, 2017) will be for projects to be conducted in fall 2017, spring 2018, and/or summer 2018.
- 3. Proposals should be submitted by individual students, but all projects must be in conjunction with a CAFE faculty mentor(s).
- 4. Proposals will be evaluated and grants awarded based upon the importance of the project relevant to the goals of the College, the quality of the proposal, the likelihood of value to advance the student's career opportunities, and aligned with priorities of the College.
 - a. As award funds are limited each year, proposals will be ranked. Proposals that are not funded may be resubmitted in the next grant cycle for reconsideration.
- 5. To be eligible for receipt of award funding, students must:
 - a. Have completed 30 credit hours or more toward their degree and be enrolled at UK at the time of funding.
 - b. Not be earning course credit on the research project for which they are applying.
 - c. Have earned at least a University of Kentucky GPA of 3.25.
- 6. Funding will be awarded as follows:
 - a. A wage of \$10/hr. for 10 hours per week is provided to the student for a period of up to 14 weeks.
 - b. Funds may be requested for supplies, materials, and travel expenses up to \$1,500.
 - c. Expenses must be justifiable expendables or travel necessary to complete the project.
 - d. Other limitations may occur during the review process.
- 7. Proposals will be reviewed by a CAFÉ faculty committee who will recommend funding priority to the Associate Dean for Research and Associate Dean for Instruction. The Research office will announce funding decisions by late November.
- 8. Funds awarded for student projects will be allocated to the faculty mentor's department business office.

- 9. All monies approved for the undergraduate experiential research program should be spent within one year of the allocation date, or the student's commencement date, whichever is earlier. Carryover of funds will be considered only in special circumstances, and must be approved in advance by the Associate Dean for Research.
- 10. End of project reports will be due within 30 days of completion of the research experience. Reports should summarize the project results and outcomes, how the funds were expended, and how the funds specifically enabled project activities. The report is to be submitted to the Associate Dean for Research.
- 11. Students will be expected to present on their project (poster or oral presentation) at the UK undergraduate research poster competition, and a local, state, regional or national meeting.
- 12. Application Materials:
 - Pg. 1. Title page
 - Title of project
 - Student name, and ID
 - Mentor name and department
 - Pg. 2. Project Description (not to exceed one page)
 - Pg. 3. Proposed activities, roles, and outcomes of undergraduate research scholar
 - Pg. 4. Budget for materials/supplies and travel, including the use of other sources of funding or any other matching funds.
