Course Description:

FAM 475: Keys to Well-Being: Lessons from the World's Longest-Lived People

Students will visit the Greek Island of Ikaria to learn how well-being, health and longevity stem from lifestyle choices. Ikaria is one of five international "Blue Zones," or aging hot spots, where people live to be a healthy 100+years old. Abroad, students will experience the Ikarian balance, which centers around purpose, family, diet, hard work, physical activity, sunshine and spirituality. Students will enhance their multicultural competency through site visits of historical, cultural, and contemporary significance. The travel component will also include 2 days in Athens.

Travel Highlights:

- Experience first-hand how lifestyle and location contribute to health and wellbeing (nature walks, cooking lessons, relaxation, spirituality)
- Learn from the island's oldest and most selfsufficient people
- Take part in a traditional family life and the island's dedication to community
- Participate in sight-seeing and historical tours
- Free time to relax, hike, enjoy wildlife and nature, learn and explore


